# **UN Updates**

## Unity Key to Addressing the Climate Crisis – Al Jaber

COP28 President-designate, Dr Sultan Al Jaber says unity, and collaboration are key to addressing the climate crisis and positioning the world for sustainable growth. This was

contained in a letter Dr Al Jaber sent to parties on 17 October, 2023. Dr. Al Jaber who recognised the need for taking solutions to scale says collaboration is key to "accelerate a transition that puts our economies on the path toward a new low-carbon, high-growth, sustainable economic model in a way that is both transformational and just." <u>Access the letter here</u>

## **Climate Action Summit to Kickstart COP28**

COP28 President-Designate Dr Sultan Al Jaber and UN Special Envoy on Climate Ambition and Solutions, Mike Bloomberg have announced that the Local Climate Action Summit which will kickstart the COP28 process, will bring together subnational leaders into the COP process. This was made known during the 78th Session of the United Nations General Assembly, in New York. The Summit which will be hosted by the COP28 Presidency in partnership with the Bloomberg Philanthropies aims at bringing local voices into the nucleus of conversations on multi-level action to drive the Paris Agreement.

The World Bank and International Monetary Fund (IMF) have agreed to encourage member states to step up their funding for the bank so that it can increase its support for vulnerable countries to fight climate change and poverty. ## Fossil-Fuel Companies Must Commit to Decarbonisation - Al Jaber



COP28 President-designate, Sultan al-Jaber, has warned that fossil-fuel companies must not be seen to be in the way of phasing down fossil-fuel investments. Al Jaber made this known while speaking to Financial Times about ongoing discussions with fossilfuel producers to commit to signing up to a Global Decarbonisation Alliance. The alliance which will be launched

## LDC Ministers Issue Dakar Declaration

Ahead of COP28, Ministers from 46 Least Developed Countries of the world have met in Dakar, Senegal, to discuss ways to address the climate crises. The meeting ended with the Dakar Declaration which "calls for urgent global emissions reductions, scaled up climate finance, a strong outcome operationalising the new fund for addressing loss and damage, and an ambitious Global Stocktake to close the gaps in global climate action." # Pan-African Parliament Calls for Implementation of Agenda 2063

This was during the Retreat of the Executive Council of the African Union which took place in Kigali, Rwanda on 1-3 October, 2023 with the theme "Accelerating Agenda 2063 Implementation". ## **Climate Change: California Ratifies Landmark Act**

California Governor, Gavin Newsom, has signed into law the Senate Bill 253 (SB 253) which was passed by the Californian Senate in September. The Act, known as the Climate Corporate Data Accountability Act, requires "requires California businesses with revenue of \$1 billion or more to disclose Scope 1 and 2 emissions beginning in 2026, followed by Scope 3 emissions in 2027". ### **Dutch Parliament Votes to Phase Out Fossil Fuel Subsidies**

Members of Parliament of the Dutch National Assembly have thrown their weight behind a motion calling on the government to commence the gradual phase out of fossil fuel subsidies. This was in support of the motion tabled by the Green Party (GroenLinks) and the Liberal Democrats (D66) party. The motion demands that the phase out be spread over a period of two, five or seven years. <u>More here</u>

The fourth meeting of the Transition Committee of the Loss and Damage Fund was held in Aswan, Egypt, on 17-20 October, 2023. Despite four days of intensive deliberations, the Committee failed to agree on where the Loss and Damage Fund will be domiciled. Another round of meetings has been scheduled to hold in Abu Dhabi from 3-5 November, 2023.

Global Parliamentary Commission on the Paris Agreement

3-4 December 2023 Dubai, UAE



Climate Parliament will be convening a Truth and Ambition summit during COP28. The summit which will take place from 3-4 December, 2023 seeks to interrogate the role of legislators in understanding the climate threat, mitigation and adaptation, and ramping up actions to meet the goals of Articles 2.1, 4.1, and 7.1 of the Paris Agreement on climate change.
