
Parliamentarians are now firmly on the international policy agenda and in processes such as the UNFCCC and COPs as never before. The slogan, '**Parliaments make COPs count,** coined by GLOBE for the first-ever Parliamentary Pavilion at COP28, now has to move from rhetoric to reality in parliamentary chambers.

GLOBE is proud to have played a role in securing this prominence. Both in taking on an organising role for the global parliamentary constituency as the <u>UNFCCC Focal Point for</u> <u>the Informal Parliamentary Group</u> since COP26. As well as in initiating numerous information and coordination services such as our multilingual "<u>Parliamentarians@COP</u>" newsletters, <u>monthly webinars</u> and <u>COP calendars</u>.

We are proud to have worked with the world's leading parliamentary organisations in hosting the first ever <u>Parliamentary Pavilion</u>, supported by the UK Government and others, and participating in the first-ever <u>Parliament Day</u>, hosted by the IPU and the UAE Parliament at COP28. We look forward to building on this partnership this year.



The <u>Parliamentary Pavilion</u> was the first time that parliamentarians and parliamentary organisations and networks had their own designated meeting and event space across the two-week COP28. This <u>short 2-minute film</u> provides a glimpse into the many varied and impactful activities held in the Parliamentary Pavilion and beyond at COP28:

Over the course of the two weeks, the <u>Parliamentary Pavilion saw more than 50 events and</u> <u>gatherings</u> in both the event space and the adjacent Meeting Room. Members of Parliaments from Australia to Zambia - and everywhere in between - across the political spectrum, took part in activities, strategy sessions and briefings.

The buzz was infectious and the following are just a few highlights from the Pavilion:

- the <u>launch of the Planet Caucus initiative</u> by Brazilian Congresswoman and indigenous leader, Célia Xakriabá
- the <u>launch of the preliminary report</u> of Global Parliamentarians' Inquiry into the Progress of Fossil Fuels Phase Out
- the first-ever <u>international launch of a report</u> by the UK Parliament's Environment Audit Committee (EAC)
- Direct link-up with the Scottish Parliament for <u>briefings directly from the COP28</u>
 Parliamentary Pavilion to Scottish MSPs
- bespoke briefings for parliamentarians by the Green Climate Fund, Adaptation Fund, Global Environmental Facility, Climate Action Tracker, NDC Partnership, etc.

<u>The Sixth United Nations Environment Assembly</u> (UNEA-6) will take place from February 26 to March 1, 2024, at the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) headquarters in Nairobi, Kenya. UNEA-6 will focus on "how multilateralism can help tackle the triple planetary crisis of climate change, nature and biodiversity loss, and pollution and waste."

EU Parliament Approves New GHG Emissions Reduction Rules



Members of the European Parliament (MEPs) have voted in support of laws prohibiting the use of misleading environmental claims backed by unsubstantiated carbon offsetting data.

Terms such as "environmentally friendly", "natural", "biodegradable", "climate neutral" or "eco" are part of those who fall under this category. The ban is to ensure that verifiable sustainable practices are fully entrenched, and greenwashing stopped. MEPs now have two years to enact laws to back this. More <u>here</u>.



Global Survey of Parliamentary Engagement in the First Global Stocktake under the Paris Agreement

The survey will assess efforts by national and regional parliaments to engage in the Global Stocktake process both prior to and after COP28, particularly in the context of preparations of updated NDCs over the course of 2024.
